BE IT REMEMBERED that on the 14th day of January, 2019, the Honorable Commissioners Court of Uvalde County, Texas convened in the Commissioners' Courtroom of the Uvalde County Courthouse. The following members were in attendance:

1. Consider and act upon call to order, invocation and pledge of allegiance:

The Honorable William R. Mitchell called the meeting of January 14, 2019 to order at 10:00 AM, followed with the invocation, led the Pledge of Allegiance and Texas Pledge Of Allegiance.

2. Consider and act upon approval of minutes:

Motion by Commissioner Pargas to approve the minutes of November 19th, December 10th, and December 28, 2018.

Seconded by Commissioner Bates.

The motion unanimously carried (3-0-1) with Commissioner Garza abstaining.

3. Consider and act upon appointments to the Uvalde County Historical Commission:

As permitted by Chapter 318 of the Texas Local Government Code in January of odd numbered years a list recommending individuals who desire to serve on the local board was provided by the Uvalde County Historical Commission for consideration.

Motion by Commissioner Bates to approve list as presented.

Seconded by Commissioner Pargas.

The motion unanimously carried (4-0). See Attached.

4. Consider and act upon resolution prohibiting discharge of wastewater in Nueces River Basin:

Sky Lewey, Resource Protection and Education Director for the Nueces River Authority gave a presentation on proposed legislation prohibiting discharge of wastewater in Nueces River Basin. A resolution is requested in support of protecting the pristine streams to the environment and economy of Uvalde County.

Motion by Commissioner Pargas to approve resolution.

Seconded by Commissioner Bates.

The motion unanimously carried (4-0). See Attached.

5. Consider an act upon report of budget amendments authorized November 13, 2018 by Commissioners Court:

On November 19, 2018 the Court authorized several amendments to the 2018-2019 Uvalde County budget. Any and all Hotel Occupancy Tax funds being held by Uvalde County from September 30, 2018 to present, collected from the Hotel Occupancy Tax by the County of Uvalde, are to be turned over to contractor Texas Hill Country River Region. The amount certified by County Auditor Alice Chapman is \$609, 077.37. Close fund 32 and create a revenue and expense line item in the General Fund to account for the 1% of Hotel Occupancy Tax allocated for Uvalde County. Payments are to be processed quarterly plus thirty days to Texas Hill Country River Region.

Motion by Commissioner Scheide to approve recommended amendments.

Seconded by Commissioner Bates.

The motion unanimously carried (4-0).

6. Consider and act upon budget amendments pertaining to Texas Hill Country River Region:

Jaimie Holmes and Annabel McNew addressed the Court regarding the Hotel Occupancy Tax budget, money balance, transfers and fund balance on monies collected by Uvalde County from the Hotel Occupancy Tax. The Court clarified and approved 25% of the total monies collected to be allocated for river cleanup and 74% for tourism as outlined in a contract between Uvalde County and Texas Hill Country River Region.

Motion by Commissioner Scheide to approve amendments and budget.

Seconded by Commissioner Garza.

The motion unanimously carried (4-0).

7. Consider and act upon proposed written budget of Texas Hill Country River Region:

Annabel McNew, Executive Director with the Texas Hill Country River Region presented a proposed written annual budget pursuant to the Promotional Services agreement between Texas Hill Country River Region and the County of Uvalde for the operating 2019 fiscal year.

Motion by Commissioner Bates to approve the budget as presented.

Seconded by Commissioner Garza.

The motion unanimously carried (4-0).

8. Consider and act upon approval of bonds of elected officials:

Official bonds and oaths were presented to the Court for newly elected officials elected to office at the General Election on November 6, 2018 and sworn into office on January 1, 2019 at 12:01 AM.

Motion by Commissioner Pargas to approve official bonds and oaths of elected officials. Seconded by Commissioner Bates.

The motion carried (4-0).

9. Consider and act upon line item budget amendments:

No amendments were presented to the court for consideration at this time. No action on this agenda item.

10. Consider and act upon Road Administrators Report:

Report by Jesse Garcia, Road Administrator. Repair CR 409 crossing, Three day brush cleanup in Knippa, Five foot hole repair on wet crossing CR 412 and blading on CR 309, CR 326, CR 327 and CR 408. Update on CR 416 pending preliminary study and engineer assessment for repair.

No action on this agenda item.

11. Consider and act upon approval of monthly reports:

Monthly reports that are on file, and subject to examination in the Uvalde County Clerk's Office, were presented for approval.

14. Consider and act upon vacancy in Road Administrator position:

A job description posted on the county's website for the position of Road Administrator was presented to the Court for consideration and a request for authorization to publish job announcement with the San Antonio Express News and Uvalde Leader News.

Motion by Commissioner Bates to approve advertising for this position.

Seconded by Commissioner Pargas

Commissioner Pargas made a second motion to keep Jesse Garcia as the Road Administrator until a replacement is hired.

Seconded by Commissioner Scheide

RESOLUTION

- WHEREAS Rivers and creeks within the Edwards Aquifer Contributing Zone identify the Texas Hill Country and support the region's visitor and recreation-based economy; and
- WHEREAS These streams are clear and pristine because they carry little or no nutrients, such as nitrogen and phosphorous; and
- WHEREAS Even the best treated wastewater carries levels of nutrients that exceed the natural levels found in most of these Hill Country streams; and
- WHEREAS The addition of nutrients to these pristine streams will degrade water quality and may result in algal blooms, fish kills and interruption of recreational use, and
- WHEREAS These streams can be protected by prohibiting direct discharge of treated wastewater and instead requiring alternative means of disposal through land application, reuse or other means, and
- WHEREAS The Uvalde County Commissioners Court recognizes the value of these pristine streams to the environment and economy of Uvalde County
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE UVALDE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT THAT

The Uvalde County Commissioners Court hereby supports legislation prohibiting the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality from authorizing the discharge of treated wastewater or pollutants into any surface water in the Contributing Zone associated with the portion of the Recharge Zone of the Edwards Aquifer that is within the Nueces River Basin.
